Now is a good time to upgrade your races

From January to March, milk production slows down on the farm.

Cows graze summer crops that have been planted to help them through the hot dry season, and some herds may be milked only once a day.

February and March are therefore good months for maintaining and investing in your farm races. Well-maintained StockRock races are both soft enough to break up if walked onto a concrete yard, yet tough enough to provide a long life. In March, the weather is fairly dry and settled, and the full spectrum of StockRock laying equipment is available to ensure a premium quality laying experience.

Ripping

Re-shaping with Grader

Compacting

Preparation and finish are key to ensuring a long-lasting race surface from StockRock.

A StockRock race is ripped and re-shaped with a grader, then track-rolled, and the surface is compacted smooth with a roller. In dry conditions, the race is dampened, to ensure a hard-wearing sealed finished StockRock surface.

StockRock farm races are typically fairly flat, with a camber of 3-6% from the centreline. On a 3-6% cambered race, cows will use the full width of the race walking to and from the milking shed, resulting in improved cow flow and increased productivity (less time spent on the journey to and from milking).
